

Criteria

MOSCA STATE TOURNAMENT

1. The Missouri State Tournament will be awarded to a qualified club that can provide the necessary experience and qualifications as well as, at a minimum, the following facilities and services needed to host such an event:
 - a) A 200 target main event with a minimum of 14 stations. The format will be one hundred targets per day, Saturday and Sunday. Two courses are not required, but if one course is used for both days, substantial changes in target presentations must be made from day one to day two.
 - b) 100 bird FITASC event (old or new style) A minimum of two parcou locations if target presentations and pegs on the parcou are changed substantially from day one to day two. (Four separate parcou are suggested)
 - c) 50 bird 5-Stand event with a minimum of two layouts (100 bird event is suggested)
 - d) 50 bird Small Gauge event with a minimum of 7 stations this will include pump and sidexside.
 - e) 100 bird Preliminary event on Friday with a minimum of 12 stations. (100 bird Preliminary event on Thursday is suggested)
 - f) 1(one) shooting game is required. (2-3 are suggested)
 - g) Adequate facilities (clubhouse, restrooms, food service, vendor space, restrooms on each course)
 - h) Acceptable hotels, motels, dining establishments, and camper facilities in close proximity
 - i) Adequate all weather parking spaces in very close proximity to events or shuttle transportation service provided
 - j) A minimum of one practice facility available during entire tournament (a 5-Stand is acceptable)
2. The date of the Missouri State Championship Tournament will be the weekend of the second Saturday in August.

3. Awards will be supplied by the MOSCA for the events
4. Scores of all events will be posted with updates multiple times per day throughout the entire tournament.
5. Shoot programs will be published and distributed a minimum of 60 (sixty days) prior to the event. The Secretary will notify NSCA of the event so as to allow them to publish the event dates in Sporting Clays Magazine, online, and anywhere else they post to publicize the event.
6. All competitors may register for the event with a \$100 (one hundred dollar) deposit.
7. The shoot shall use experienced well trained referees preferably 18 years of age or older, ideally experienced shooters that are not shooting in the event. Club will also comply with mandatory NSCA requirement by insuring that all shooters, spectators, referees and pullers wear proper eye and ear protection.
8. Options for the events will be determined by the host club with all payouts being mailed out within 14 days of the event closure. Club will forward all results of events to the MOSCA Treasurer within 48 hours who will in turn post the results online. Host club will also mail to each shooter participant the shooting results for the event, including total payout information of all options, purses and classes.
9. Shoot offs shall be held the same day the event is completed, if at all possible. Shoot offs are required for 1st place (at a minimum) in every class for the main event and for high overall on all other events. Traps for the shoot offs will be used exclusively for the shoot offs (a 5-stand or a shooting game may be adjusted to comply with this criteria).
10. A social function is required on Saturday evening. Either a cocktail party or dinner is acceptable.

11. All events in the State Tournament will be registered. NSCA Fees and MOSCA fees will be charged to all entrants. Reports and fees will be sent to the NSCA and MOSCA within 14 days of tournament completion.
12. If any additional fees are to be added to the published entry fee, such as sales tax, the amounts must be disclosed in the event application and in all programs, shooter forms, and advertisements and online if fees are quoted.
13. Clubs desiring to be considered for the State Tournament must submit an application to the MOSCA Secretary on or before June 1st , which will be for the State Tournament that will be held one year in the future from the application deadline.
13. Timeline for State Tournament:
 - a. June 1st Clubs must have applications to MOSCA Secretary.
 - b. June 15th Deadline for MOSCA Board to approve applications, send out the voting ballots.
 - c. July 15th announce which club will hold state tournament for the following year.
14. To be qualified to apply for state tournament the club must be in good standing with the NSCA and MOSCA for the entire year prior to their application, have thrown a minimum of 10,000 targets in a calendar year, must have a sufficient number of events scheduled in current calendar year to register 10,000 targets, have conducted a NSCA registered tournament with at least 100 shooters in the main event.
