

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of MOSCA  
August 9, 2008

Meeting was called to order by President Gary Walstrom at 6:09pm at Ozark Shooters.

Secretary Andy Spann moved for approval of the prior meeting. Motion was seconded and passed.

There was no old or new business brought forward from the membership.

The Board brought forward the following:

As of the date of the meeting no Club had applied for the 2009 State Shoot. An application may be forthcoming from River Hills.

Some bylaw changes are forthcoming but all members need to be given an opportunity to see the bylaw changes and vote. Recommended changes will come out in the fall of 2008.

Due to cash surplus in the MOSCA account at the time of this State shoot, 80 cases of shells will be given away at the dinner on Saturday.

MOSCA expects to run at a surplus in 2009 of as much as \$10,000, depending on shooting activity. Suggestions were taken from the floor as to how to spend that money. Some of the suggestions were as follows:

Reduce tournament fees to Missouri residents.

Develop a youth and women shooting instruction program.

Find ways to attract more women to the sport.

Ask instructors and better shooters to host clinics. MOSCA provides free ammo and targets.

Sponsor high school programs.

Check into the National Endowment F for shooting (Potterfield.)

Tie in instruction to the Missouri Hunter Safety Program.

It was announced that the MOSCA Board was donating a Beretta 391 for raffle.

The concept of The Missouri Triple Crown was announced by Kevin Pickett. This would be three sporting clays tournaments with side events. The cumulative score of the three

sporting clays events would determine the prize winners. MOSCA funds would be supplement the prizes but corporate sponsors would be sought also.

Treasurer Rosenthal gave the Treasurers report. \$5,430 was raised to date. There was \$4,429 in expenses, including the cost of the shells which were given away. The clubs which threw the most targets were Ozark Shooters, River Hills and Washburn.

Gratitude was expressed from the floor and applauded by most in attendance for the efforts of the Board in getting the MOSCA started.

Secretary Spann mentioned that hats and patched would be made available for sale through the clubs.

The meeting was adjourned at 7pm.
